

The Isle of Wight Before 1066 (Anglo-Saxons) Digital Heritage Map Quiz Activity Sheet

Question	
1	<p>This is a view of the Isle of Wight taken from space by a satellite (called a satellite map). Zoom in and see if you can find the place where your school is on the map</p>
2	<p>Each of the red pins on the map marks the spot where an object or several objects from history have been found on the Island. All of these objects (often called artefacts) are over 1,000 years old.</p> <p>Click on a pin on the coast near the sea to select an object. Write down the name of the object you choose:</p>
3	<p>Click on a pin in the middle of the Island away from the sea to select another object. Write down the name of the object you choose:</p>

4	<p>The Anglo-Saxons were not the first people to migrate to and live on the Isle of Wight. This map contains evidence for objects that come from one of the seven periods of history that happened before 1066 and the Norman Conquest.</p> <p>Before we focus on the Anglo-Saxons, we are going to find evidence for the Isle of Wight being occupied in each of these seven periods of history.</p> <p>Click on the pins on the map and find an object for each of the seven periods of history given on this timeline below. Add its name to the right period on the timeline.</p>

Now we are going to find out more about the Anglo-Saxon objects on our map. To do this we use the search box at the top left of the screen which looks like this:



5 Type *Anglo-Saxon* into the search box and a list of objects appears. Select one by highlighting it and press 'enter'. You will zoom into that item and the place where it was found.

Write down the name of the object here and the place that it was found. Draw a picture of it on a separate piece of paper (you can open the large photograph of it on the map to help you see the object better).

6 Type *Shalcombe* into the search box and press 'enter'. Write down the name of one of the objects that appears in that place (or location). Take the fourth letter of the material the object is made from and write it down here

7	Type <i>Shalfleet</i> into the search box and press 'enter'. Take the second letter of the material the object is made from and write it down here
8	Type <i>Bowcombe</i> into the search box and press 'enter'. Using the first object on the list, take the second letter of the object name and write it down here
9	The 3 letters you now have spell a word if put in the right order. What is that word?
