

The Isle of Wight Before 1066 Digital Heritage Map Quiz Activity Sheet

1	<p>This is a view of the Isle of Wight taken from space by a satellite (called a satellite map). Zoom in and see if you can find the place where your school is on the map</p>
2	<p>Each of the red pins on the map marks the spot where an object or several objects from history have been found on the Island. All of these objects (often called artefacts) are over 1,000 years old.</p> <p>Click on a pin on the coast near the sea to select an object. Write down the name of the object you choose:</p>
3	<p>Click on a pin in the middle of the Island away from the sea to select another object. Write down the name of the object you choose:</p>

4	<p>Each of these objects comes from one of the seven periods of history that happened before 1066 and the Norman Conquest.</p> <p>Click on the pins on the map and find an object for each of the seven periods of history given on this timeline below. Add its name to the right period on the timeline, write down what it is made of and draw a picture.</p>

7	<p>Type <i>Bouldnor Cliff</i> into the search box and press 'enter'. Write down the name of one of the objects that appears in that place (or location). Which period is it from? What is it made of? What was it used for?</p>
