

Isle of Wight 1700 – 1900 Digital Explorer Quiz (KS2)

Question	
Q1	<p>This is a view of the Isle of Wight taken from space by a satellite (called a satellite map). Make the map bigger by zooming in to it and see if you can find the place where your school is on the map</p>
Q2	<p>Each of the orange pins on the map marks a place (like your school) on the Island connected to the story of an object from history. All of these objects, often called artefacts and documents, date from the 1700s (C18th) and 1800s (C19th).</p> <p>Click on a pin on the coast near the sea to select an object.</p> <p>Write down what the object is you have found:</p> <p>What am I? <input data-bbox="707 922 2033 1010" type="text"/></p> <p>Your answer:</p>
Q3	<p>Click on a pin in the middle of the Island away from the sea to select another object.</p> <p>Write down what the object is you have found:</p> <p>What am I? <input data-bbox="707 1155 2033 1243" type="text"/></p> <p>Your answer:</p>

Q4

Each of the objects tell us something about everyday life on the Island during the C18th and C19th.

Click on the pins shown in the map and find an artefact or document that links to each of the five **history subjects** below.

(You will need to scroll down in the object's pop-up window to read about the artefact/document, and to find your answers).

As you discover each one:

1. Write its name under the correct **subject**
2. Write down what it is made of
3. Draw a small picture



We can use our map to search for individual objects and find out more about them – including:

- Where they were found
- And what they were used for

To do this we use the search box at the top left of the screen which looks like this:



Q5

Type **Carisbrooke Castle** into the search box and press 'enter'.

Can you make out Carisbrooke Castle on the map?

Click on each of the 3 pins at the Castle until you find the object made of gold silk

What is it?

What was it used for?

Write down the first letter of its name from (What am I?) here:

When you have finished answering this question:

- Click anywhere on the map to close the pop-up window.
- Now click on the 'Home' button top left (it looks like a house!) to zoom out.
- Finally, click on the 'X' in the search box to clear your last search.



Q6

Type **House of Industry** into the search box and press 'enter'.

Click on the pin and investigate both artefacts (use the arrow at the top of the pop-up window to move between the two).

Don't forget to scroll down to the bottom of the item's pop-up window and open the larger Attachment picture(s)



What familiar building on the Island today includes the building that was the House of Industry?

What is the building?

Which of the two artefacts you looked at above was a gift?

What is it?

How old is it?

Who made it?

And what was it used for?

Now close the pop-up window, click the home button and clear the search box as before.

Q7

Type **East Cowes** into the search box and press 'enter'.

Click on the pin in the blue box and investigate the three artefacts you find there.

Use the arrow(s) at the top of the pop-up window to move between them.

Find the object that is made of hazel wood.

What is it?

Who used it?

And what was it used for?

Write down the second letter of the object's name here:

You now have three letters. If you put them together in the right order, they will spell a word we use today which has its origins in the early C18th.

What is that word?
