

The Isle of Wight Before 1066 Digital Explorer Quiz (KS2)

Question	
Q1	<p>This is a picture (view) of the Isle of Wight taken from space by a camera on a satellite and is called a satellite map. Make the map bigger by zooming in to it and see if you can find the place where your school is.</p>
Q2	<p>Each of the orange pins on the map marks a place on the Island (like your school) where an object or several objects from history have been found on the Island. All of these objects (often called artefacts) are over 1,000 years old.</p> <p>Click on a pin on the coast near the sea to select an object.</p> <p>Write down what the object is you have found:</p> <p>What am I? Your answer: <input type="text"/></p>
Q3	<p>Click on a pin in the middle of the Island away from the sea to select another object.</p> <p>Write down what the object is you have found:</p> <p>What am I? Your answer: <input type="text"/></p>

<p>Q4</p> <p>Each of the objects on the map comes from one of the seven periods of history and prehistory that happened before 1066 and the Norman Conquest.</p> <p>Click on the pins on the map and find an object (artefact) for each of the seven periods of history given on the timeline below, and for each:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Write down its name 2. Write down what it is made of 3. Draw a small picture.

	<p>We can use our map to search for individual objects and find out more about them – including where they were found and what they were used for. To do this we use the search box at the top left of the screen which looks like this:</p>
Q5	<p>Type Chessell Down into the search box.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose an object from the list that appears. Select by highlighting it, and press ‘enter’. You will then zoom in to that item, and the place where it was found. <p>Write down the name of the object you have chosen:</p> <input type="text"/> <p>Which period is it from?</p> <input type="text"/> <p>What is it made of?</p> <input type="text"/> <p>And what was it used for?</p> <input type="text"/> <p>When you have finished answering this question:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click anywhere on the map to close the pop-up window.
