1882 mixed Endowed School, Newchurch, opens

1883 St John's road Board Schools, Ryde, opens

1901 Sandown Secondary Grammar opens

1904 Newport Technical College and Seely Library opened

1906 Freshwater Windmill Lane School opens

1907 Newport County Secondary Grammar opens

1957-8 Newport Grammar moves to Carisbrooke

1964 Ryde High School opens (now Ryde Academy)

British History (a few dates)

1757 Warrington Academy established

1785 Sunday School Society established

1788 Chimney Sweepers Act – minimum age 8 years

1799 School of industry opened, Kendal

1802 Factory Act – factory owners to provide some education

1824 Infant School Society founded

1834 Poor Law Amendment Act – all relief should be given in workhouses, and children receive education daily

1870 Elementary Education Act – compulsory education 5-13

1889 Children's Charter – prevention of cruelty to children

1902 Education Act – introduced secondary education

1947 – school leaving age raised to 15 years

1948 Children's Act – children's officer in each local authority

1973 – school leaving aged raised to 16 years

1975 Sex Discrimination Act – promoting equal opportunities
